PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR WINTER WEATHER

Winter weather is here and the City of Carmel Utilities would like to remind you to take precautions to protect the plumbing in your home from freezing during extremely cold temperatures.

- If you have pipes along an outside wall allow a small trickle of water to run at night to keep the pipes from freezing. The cost of the extra water is low compared to a frozen pipe.
- Open cabinet doors to expose pipes along outside walls to warmer room temperatures.



- Insulate both hot and cold water pipes in an area that is likely to freeze since hot water pipes have a tendency to freeze first.
- Keep your garage door closed whenever possible during cold spells.
- Before the frost hits, make sure to drain and store garden hoses.
- Know where your main water shut-off valve is. If a pipe freezes or breaks, shut the water off immediately.





Traveling during periods of cold weather?

Please consider these measures as well:


- Make arrangements with a friend or neighbor to periodically do a house check to make sure the heat is working.
- Never turn off the heat keep the thermostat at least 65 degrees. Anything lower than 50 degrees may cause frozen pipes.





Check your basement or crawl space sump pump.
 Inspecting the sump pump to ensure it's working correctly will save time and money.

2023 Rain on Main

The ninth annual Rain on Main event, a popular painted rain barrel contest and auction, kicked off Friday, August 11, with a display of 20 decorated barrels in the Carmel Arts & Design District. This event was presented by Carmel Utilities, Carmel Department of Storm Water Management and the Hamilton County Soil and Water Conservation District. The barrels were prominently featured along Main Street through the following week and then relocated to the Carmel Farmers Market on Saturday, August 19, for the final day and on-line auction.

Rain on Main uses art on ordinary barrels to help educate the public about the value of water efficiency. Rain barrels have grown in popularity across the country and decorated barrels provide a beautiful visual element to landscaping and are a great way to save water and help the environment.

Net proceeds from the auction support water education in Carmel Clay Parks, including signage, some of which has been installed at Founders Park (located at 116th Street and Hazel Dell Parkway) using funding generated by Rain on Main. Additionally, Carmel residents who install a rain barrel are eligible to apply for a \$50 rebate per barrel from the City's Storm Water Utility.
